

**PROCEDURES CIRCULAR
NO. (16) FOR THE YEAR 2022**

With reference to:

- The Customs Law No. 207 for the year 2020.
- The Executive Regulation of the Customs Law promulgated by Ministerial decree No. 430 for the year 2021.
- Procedures Circular No. 25 for the year 2022.
- The endorsement of the First Undersecretary / Director General of the Customs Authority dated 25/8/2022 annotating “No objection” on re-exportation of cargoes banned from entering the Country.
- In unification of the customs procedures, facilitation on Customs dealers and for transparency regarding transport of rejected cargoes by the supervisory authorities that is sold for re-exportation.

The following shall be considered:

- No re-exportation of rejected consignments by the competent supervisory authorities and the abandoned cargoes that are sold by auction for re-exportation or the consignment that its owners request its re-exportation shall be allowed except from the same port that the consignment is located in without transportation to other ports unless shipping is to a destination that does not have a shipping line at the said port provided that a statement is submitted by the concerned chamber of shipping to that effect and the approval of the competent Head of the Central Administration following undertaking the stipulated Customs procedures and guarantees in that regard provided these cargoes are transferred under Customs control and police custody.

The above has been sent for your kind knowledge and to be thoroughly implemented.
